


Using the Live Chat on Youtube during worship.

1. Please join in! it's great to see who else is taking part in the worship.
2. The best times to join in are
 - a. At the start, so we can greet each other
 - b. During the peace (when we have communion) to wish each other 'peace be with you'
 - c. To send in requests for prayer for our time of intercessions.
 - d. A brief response to particular parts of the service (songs, sermon etc.)
 - e. Especially at the end, during 'virtual coffee', which is a great time to chat, exchange news, and engage as a community.
3. Please do *not* use the comments to start a separate conversation to what is going on with the service. The comments should help us engage with the service, rather than distract from it.
4. If you find the comments are distracting you from the service, use the 'full screen' button (circled below), which will hide all the comments.
5. If (as happened on Sunday) an unknown user makes critical or inappropriate comments *please ignore them*. We are looking at how we can moderate and control unhelpful comments during the service.
6. We do hope and pray that new people will join us through the online worship, so please be welcoming to new people in the comments.
7. Finally, please be kind to the worship leader. In our church buildings we would have 15+ people involved on a Sunday morning. That's now not possible. We are still learning how to make this work well, for both churches, all ages, and all stages of faith. Please pray for Ruth and David (and Becky, Chris and Lily too), and thankyou for all your prayers and encouragement so far.
