St Peters Gift Day: we are looking at holding a Gift Day for St Peters on Pentecost (Sunday 28th June), to fund the final set of refurbishments on St Peters, including a full heating system, window blinds, treating the floor and several other improvements. More details soon, but it makes sense to get this work done whilst we are out of the church, so we would like to raise the funds in June so we can do the work in July.

As the lockdown is slowly released, we are aware that *restrictions on church buildings* may start being lifted. We will keep you posted on this - progress is likely to be slow, and anything like 'normal' worship and gathering is still a long way off. The first stage is likely to be use for personal prayer, and small ceremonies for weddings and funerals.

Even once this is announced, it may take some time to get the church buildings ready for use.

For those who have asked, here are the bank *details for both churches*. If you usually give by envelope or cash and are able to give through the bank, that would be really helpful. Our monthly income is down about £500 at St Peters since lockdown, and about £2000 per month at St James.
