### **What's On?**

**Private Prayer:** St. James' Church is open for Prayer twice a week. This is on Tuesdays from 2 - 4 pm and on Saturdays from 11 am - 1 pm. Social distancing and face coverings must continue until further notice.

**Christian Aid Week:** This takes place between 10th & 16th May. Christian Aid UK uses our donations to help families overcome poverty and injustice in 29 countries around the world. This year one of the priorities is the climate emergency. Envelopes are available at both St. James' and St. Peter's Churches when they are open. Please return envelopes by 23rd May at the latest and remember to 'Gift Aid' where possible. If you have difficulty accessing envelopes, please contact the church wardens for advice.

**Thy Kingdom Come:** 'Thy Kingdom Come' is a global interdenominational prayer movement launched by the Church of England six years ago. This year between Ascension Day and Pentecost (13-23 May) thousands of Christians throughout the world will be praying, specifically for family and friends to come to faith in Jesus. In doing so, we remember the first disciples praying in the upper room as they waited for the Holy Spirit to come to empower them for the mission of sharing the good news of Jesus. We would love to support everyone in praying together between 13-23 May, so look out for news coming soon of special prayer times at St James', a virtual 'upper room' for continuous prayer, and ideas for praying in different and creative ways on your own, with your children, or with friends and family. "They (the eleven apostles) went up to the upper room...devoting themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers." (Acts 1.13-14)

**Ascension Day:** There will be a service of Holy Communion at 7.30 pm in St. James' Church on Ascension Day, Thursday, 13th May. (No need to book for this service, but please keep to social distancing regulations.)

**Coffee morning:** Our first coffee morning after lockdown will be held on the first Thursday of the month, 6<sup>th</sup> May 10-11 a.m. We will have to follow all Covid rules so we will be outside in the churchyard. (We can meet as groups of 6 or 2 households.) Because it's in the churchyard please bring your own chair (church room chairs tend to sink into the ground so it could be a lot further to get up than when you sat down) and wear suitable clothing. We can only serve coffee this month, so, if you fancy a biscuit, please bring your own. We really look forward to seeing you.

**Midweek Communions** are restarting. Hurrah! Midweek communion will be held at St James' on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Wednesdays of the month at 12 noon, and the first one is going to be on the 19th May. We are going to trial St Peter's with them too, on the 2nd Wednesday of the month, the first one being on the 12th May. This is a short service of around 30 minutes, with no music, but you do not need to book for it, so please just turn up.

**Gift Day:** On Pentecost Sunday this year (23rd May) we are going to celebrate the Holy Spirit coming down to earth by holding a gift day at St James'. With the restrictions having been in place tightly over the last few months, we have lost significant income through plate donations, and through a lack of baptisms and weddings, and of course fundraising has come to a halt. The church is therefore running at a deficit, and we need to ask the church to help us through this next year. Please spend the next few weeks praying about this, and how you can support us. Details of how to give will be available nearer the time.
